The Philosophical Research Center, Athens, Greece, since its inception in 1974, has made a significant contribution to philosophy in Greece. In addition, DEUCALION, the Center's quarterly publication, has been instrumental in making contemporary philosophic work accessible to a Greek audience.

We have learned that, since the expiration of a five-year grant from the Ford Foundation, New York, the Center, faced with grave financial difficulties, may be forced to cease functioning.

We believe that such an outcome will cause a harmful interruption in the connections which, through the Center's seminars and lectures and through its quarterly, have been so far established between Greece and other countries in the field of philosophy. It would also destroy the preconditions for original philosophic research which the Center's activities have created to date.

We therefore appeal to all those who find such a project worthwhile, to support in every possible way the Center and its associates in their efforts to maintain a creative interaction between the Greek philosophic tradition and language and contemporary philosophic thought.
